It looks like the digital revolution has claimed a few more scalps.

Nikon have announced that they are stopping production on all but two models of their film based SLR cameras, the top of the range F6 and the entry level FM10 are now the only film SLR's being produced while they now concentrate their efforts in the digital arena.

The popular medium format camera manufacturer, Bronica has stopped production of all cameras', lenses, and accessories. It has been stated that they were killed off by lack of development and commitment in recent times.
