

Hello again,



## Upcoming events

- **September monthly meeting:**  
Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> Sept, from 7.30pm. The competition theme is 'Four photos that tell a story'. Our guest judge will be Robert Groom, who will speak about landscapes and outdoor photography on the night. Competition entries *MUST* be received by Kath by Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> August. Entries must be of four photos. These photos should tell a story (your interpretation). They can be (but do not have to be) in a particular order. If there is an order, please number the entries #1, #2, etc. The 4 photos can be individually mounted, or mounted together on a single mount. Please keep the size of the 4 photos consistent.
- **Parklands/Preston photography inter-club competition/night**  
Preston will host this year's inter-club night. It will be held on Monday August 25<sup>th</sup> – ie **tonight!**
- **Oct theme:**  
October (theme = open): up to photo photos per member, with complete choice regarding the subject matter. This is the last of the regular meetings for the year, and a chance to submit your best/favourite photos.

There also isn't a time limit, but everyone's encouraged to submit a contemporary image – we learn a lot more by shooting regularly, rather than delving into our 'shoeboxes' for old photos.
