
Hello All,

How to photograph...Splash

This can be a tricky one as it involves quite a bit of set up. However, the end results can be stunning. It also involves a lot of patience. There are an endless number of ways to set up the water. Often people will use a small plastic bag suspended over a bowl. Pricking a small hole in the bag will mean a slow steady stream of drops. See the sites below for some suggestions. Alternatively, type 'splash' into the flickr site for some inspiration. Test your drops to see where you need to be focused, and importantly make sure your gear is far enough back so as to not get wet. Keep a towel ready just in case.

Photographer of the Month - Anne Geddes Baby Photographer

Australian-born photographer Anne Geddes is regarded as one of the most famous children's photographers in the world. She is best known for her stylized depictions of babies. Most of her work features infants dressed as plants, flowers, animals and butterflies. Her most recent photos include children dressed as fairies and other mystical creatures. Geddes' iconic images have graced everything from award-winning books and calendars to postage stamps and album covers. The soft-spoken, self-taught photographer once revealed that her images aim to capture the purity, vulnerability, and preciousness of children. Geddes added that her life's goal is to illustrate to the world that each and every child must be protected, nurtured, and loved.
